World Book Day Celebration, Friday 6th March 2026

For our World Book Day Celebration this year, we would like to invite the children to our very special **“Dress as a Word” Parade**. The focus is on vocabulary, so we would like the children to dress up as a word of their choice. Your child could dress up as an adjective (e.g. happy, athletic, colourful), a noun, (e.g. rain, superstar, detective) or a verb (e.g. dance, swim, read) —the list is endless!

Tips for Success:

- **Include the word:** Make a sign, nametag or headband to display the word and its definition
- **Use props:** Props can make the word easier to guess (e.g. carrying a ‘broken’ object for the word ‘broken’)
- **Keep it Simple:** Use everyday clothes, stickers or cardboard to create effective costumes.

If your child already has a World Book Day costume in mind, then they could still dress as their favourite character and chose a word to describe them!
