This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

- Our school provides regular music lessons taught by the class teacher.
- We use Charanga Scheme that builds in progression across the school.
- We are using Music Technology within music lessons allowing children to compose their own music.
- We have many opportunities for children to perform throughout the year in Class Assemblies and Music Concerts.
- Our musical performances continue to be of a high quality in Class Assemblies, Year 6 Production, KS1 Nativity and Church Services and children are proud of their achievements and performances.
- We provide engaging and enthusiastic Singing Worship every week showing a love of music within our school.

- The general enjoyment of music across the school – new display to show music successes
- There are opportunities to both watch and take part in quality live performances
- The Year 5/6 classes have the opportunity to learn the ukulele from an experienced teacher.
- The Year 1-5 children have the opportunity to learn the glockenspiel linked to Charanga from Class Teacher.

Part B: Co-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

We have many opportunities for children to experience extracurricular music.

- Rocksteady – instruments include, drums, bass, keyboard, vocals and guitar –
- Chimes
- Bell Ringing
- Mrs Carey’s music lessons including flute, violin piano and guitar.
- Choir - There is an enthusiastic choir – 30 children in KS2 & KS1 who perform in locally organised events including Bath Abbey and Wiltshire Music Centre.
- Our Music Group performs in Singing Worship and Church Worship.

Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

- We have many opportunities for children to perform throughout the year in Class Assemblies and Music Concerts.
- Our musical performances continue to be of a high quality in Class Assemblies, Year 6 Production, KS1 Nativity and Church Services and children are proud of their achievements and performances.
- We enjoy an engaging and enthusiastic Singing Worship every week showing a love of music within our school.
- There have been choir performances for both KS1+2 in the Church as well as KS2 Choir performances in Wiltshire Music Centre and Bath Abbey with Voices for Life Choir.
- Our Music Group performs in Singing Worship and Church Worship.

- We are always looking for opportunities for musicians to visit our school to perform for the children and inspire a love of music.
